Dear Residents of Huntcliff Summit,

I hope everyone is finding a safe and healthy way to enjoy this holiday season! I know the holidays are very different this year and we are all making some difficult decisions to adjust how we celebrate.

One great area of hope is that the COVID-19 vaccines are showing promise and will hopefully soon be available. Sunrise continues to work with government agencies and other healthcare associations to stay up to date with the developments regarding the vaccine. We have confirmed that Sunrise communities' will participate in priority deployment of the vaccine for our team members and our residents. We will be partnering with CVS for our vaccine distribution. I will be participating in a COVID-19 Vaccine Clinical Process Program webinar on Monday, December 7th to learn more about the distribution. We will NOT have the ability to choose which vaccine we will receive (Moderna or Pfizer). The COVID-19 vaccine clinics will be carried out very similar to our flu shot clinics. More information will be coming after our webinar next week.

While we wait for this vaccine, we are not taking our focus off the hard work required each day to promote health and safety in our community. We continue a robust infection control program and we have now expanded that to include a COVID-19 testing program for our team members. Throughout the pandemic, Huntcliff Summit has followed local Dept. of Health orders on phased opening and on testing. This past week we initiated a testing program based on the positivity rate in Fulton County. Here is what the testing program looks like:

- If the positivity rate is under 5%, we will test 25% of team members on weekly basis so that all our team members are tested each month.
- If the positivity rate is above 5%, we will test 100% of our team members on a weekly basis.

As of 12/1 Fulton County positivity rate was 5.5%.

Each week I will provide you with an update on our testing status. This week, we had 3 team members test positive and those team members are following the

quarantine requirements set by the CDC. In all 3 cases, we were able to contact trace the source.

We continue to monitor residents each day for signs or symptoms and can provide testing with a 24-36 hour result time if a resident is symptomatic.

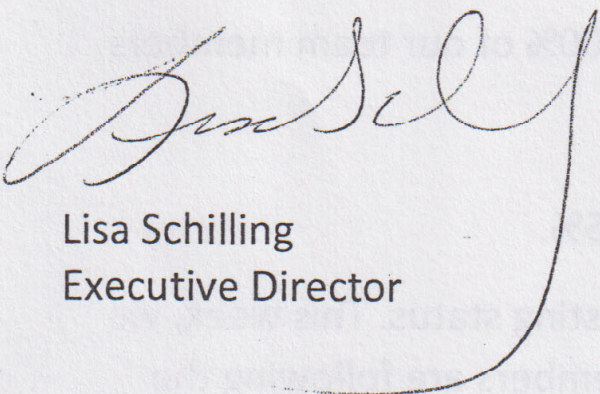
I understand that this may come as difficult news and you likely have many questions. Please know that we are prepared to respond, and your safety and well-being and our team members remains our focus. The precautions we continue to have in place include:

- Mandatory handwashing and PPE trainings for team members
- Following applicable visitor restrictions
- Conducting resident monitoring of temperature and respiratory symptoms
- Screening individuals who enter our community, including team members at the start of each shift
- Using appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE)
- Promoting social distancing
- Regularly sanitizing surfaces

I know many are hearing more about "COVID-fatigue" however we all need to remain diligent in following the guidelines set by the CDC. We are asking everyone to avoid non-essential trips outside the community, to wear a face mask, social distance, avoid any gatherings, and practice good hand hygiene at all times.
